Standard Chartered Hong Kong temporarily suspended branch operations in Admiralty until further notice due to traffic disruption

Hong Kong, 12 June 2019 – To ensure safety of staff and customers, Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited announced that it has suspended the operations of the two branches in Admiralty due to severe traffic disruption in the area. Banking services in Admiralty district, including branch services, cheque deposit service, ATMs and cash and deposit machines, are temporarily suspended until further notice.
