# Standard Chartered Hong Kong branches to be temporarily closed on Saturday for three weeks after Chinese New Year

**26 January 2022, Hong Kong** – In light of the rapidly evolving epidemic situation in Hong Kong, in order to safeguard the health and safety of our clients and employees while maintaining the availability of its banking services, Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited (“Standard Chartered Hong Kong”) announces that most of its bank branches, Priority Banking Centres and Priority Private Centre will be closed on Saturday for three consecutive weeks after Chinese New Year, i.e. 5, 12 and 19 February.
